Repository Hosting: TDL hosts open source DSpace, a centralized storage, management, and publication system which accepts any digital asset and makes it available online.

ETD Submission and Management: With TDL's Vireo, an electronic thesis and dissertation submission and management system, graduate schools, libraries, and students can easily handle the ETD process via a customizable interface.

Open Journal Hosting: TDL offers managed hosting of scholarly open access journals to faculty, staff, and students at TDL member institutions.
